

KEN CHRISTIANSON EXEMPLARY SERVICE

The Exemplary Service Award is given to dedicated SigEps who have served the organization for at least 20 years. We are proud to announce our very own Ken Christianson received the award in Los Angeles at CLA.

Ken began volunteering for SigEp in 1998. In that time, he's served his chapter as AVC president, vice president of communication, vice president of fundraising, and vice president of property management. After his WA Alpha closed in 2003, Ken spearheaded an \$800,000 capital campaign for housing and scholarships to reopen the chapter. A life trustee of the SigEp Educational Foundation, he's been a member of the SigEp National Housing Board since 2015.

Our chapter wouldn't be what it is today without Ken's tireless work and dedication to WA Alpha. His 20 years of selfless service has produced unparalleled success in Greek life at Washington State.

Under his leadership, WA Alpha has played host to three Buchanan Cups, the top GPA of all Greek organizations at WSU, six student body (ASWSU) presidents and vice presidents, two student regents, and four SigEp regional directors since the chapters re-chartering in 2005.

SigEp has started a \$50,000 endowment in Ken's name to financially assist WA Alpha's future CLA attendees.

BALANCED MAN SCHOLARSHIP 2019

WA Alpha prides itself in the ability to consistently identify and recruit categorically balanced men year in and year out. Our most effective tool in this endeavor has been the Balanced Man Scholarship (BMS).

The BMS is open to first-year students attending Washington State in the fall of 2019. The scholarship is awarding \$4,000, and the application takes only a handful of minutes to complete. There is no requirement of joining the fraternity in order to be eligible to apply or win the scholarship. The application deadline is May 31. It only takes a handful of minutes to apply!
